## Competition Entry Rules

- All entries should be signed by a teacher, tutor or youth worker.
- The video clip must be filmed by a group of pupils (we suggest 5-10 children and young people)
- There should be no more than 3 entries per school / college / youth club.
- The video clip must be no longer than 7 minutes
- The video clip can be filmed by video camera, or even by mobile phone – but marks will be given for the quality of presentation

• The winning video clips will be hosted on You Tube Pupil Voice Wales channel, and should be submitted in the following format:

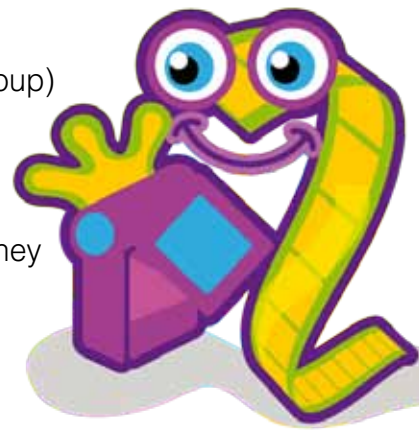
- Up to 2 GB in size
- Up to 7 minutes in length
- FLV, MPEG-2 and MPEG-4

- All material submitted or generated as part of the competition shall be licensed to the Welsh Assembly Government on a royalty free, non-exclusive, worldwide licence in perpetuity in accordance with these terms and conditions. The Welsh Assembly Government reserve the right to use the text, images and/or recordings in whole or in part in whatever way they think fit (which may be unrelated to this competition), including the web, without permission of the entrant or payment for such use.
- The Welsh Assembly Government will only use personal details in so far as is necessary for the competition subject always to the provisions of the Data Protection Act 1988.
- Judging of entries will be carried out by a panel appointed by the Welsh Assembly Government, including children and young people. Their decision will be final.
- Funding for the 2 winning days out will be released on receipt of a description of the planned activity and a break-down of costs. The Welsh Assembly Government reserves the right to change prize details at any time.
